One mile south of Bunceton, Missouri on Route J, going east from Bunceton, and where Route B turns north (left) to continue to Boonville, and Route J continues east, then turns north to Prairie Home, Missouri.

This old Presbyterian Church and Cemetery stood here for many years. It was a landmark. When the old church was closed, it has been reported that, most of the remains and markers were removed to the Masonic Cemetery in Bunceton, Missouri.
